Biography:

Brad Lane is a Commissioner assigned to the Atlanta Hub of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS).

Commissioner Lane mediates collective bargaining negotiations, grievances, discrimination complaints, negotiability appeals, public policy issues, negotiated rulemaking, and pleadings before federal regulatory bodies. He is a trainer and facilitator who delivers tailored programs on topics related to labor-management relations—negotiations, contract administration, the steward-supervisor relationship, interest based problem-solving, the neuroscience of conflict, working styles, generational differences, mediation skills and workplace diversity. In addition to providing conflict resolution services, Brad presents at various conferences and recently had the honor of serving a special assignment for the White House.

Prior to joining FMCS, Mr. Lane worked in the private land development industry. He was involved in a variety of projects in the residential, commercial, and industrial markets where he was responsible for utility construction, survey and machine control, and general project management. Mr. Lane later served the United States Air Force as both a civilian Analyst and a Labor & Employee Relations Advisor. He went on to lead as a Labor & Employee Relations Officer with the Defense Logistics Agency where he was as an advisor, negotiator, and advocate.

Mr. Lane was a regional representative with the Georgia Economic Development Academy, board member for the Graduate Program Review Board at Georgia College & State University, and volunteers with various non-profit organizations. He is a member of the Labor and Employee Relations Association, the Society of Federal Labor & Employee Relations Professionals, and supports the Georgia Labor Management Conference Board. He is also a registered neutral in the state of Georgia.
